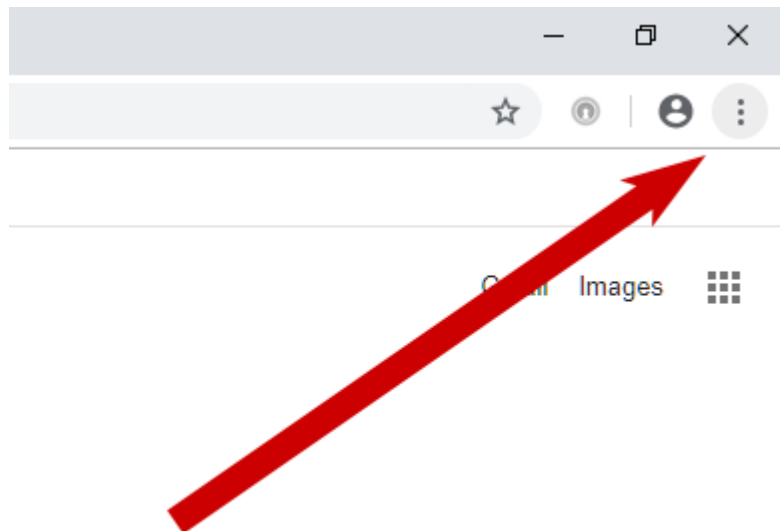


Step-by-Step Guide to Flash Settings in Google Chrome

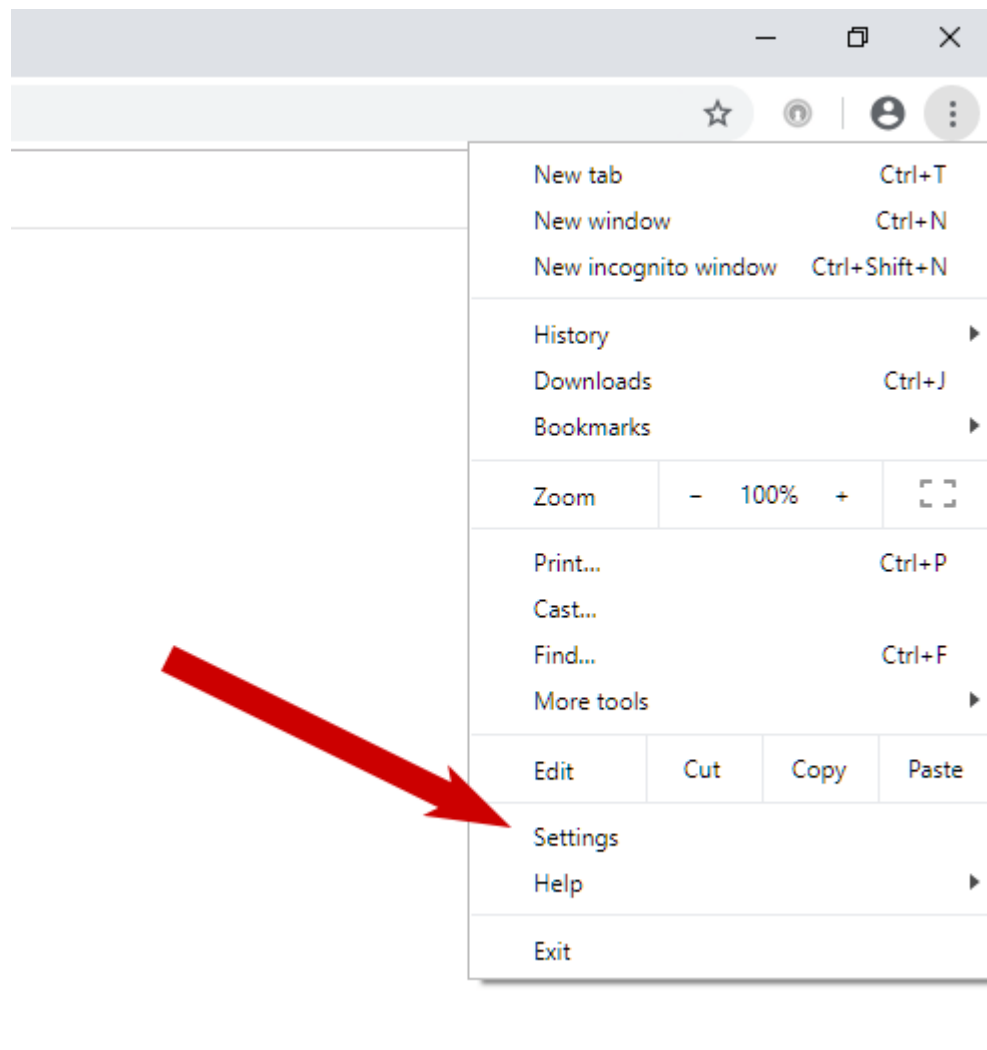
Step 1

Click on the round button in the top right corner.



Step 2

Click on 'Settings' in the drop-down menu.



Step 3

Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on the 'Advanced' button.

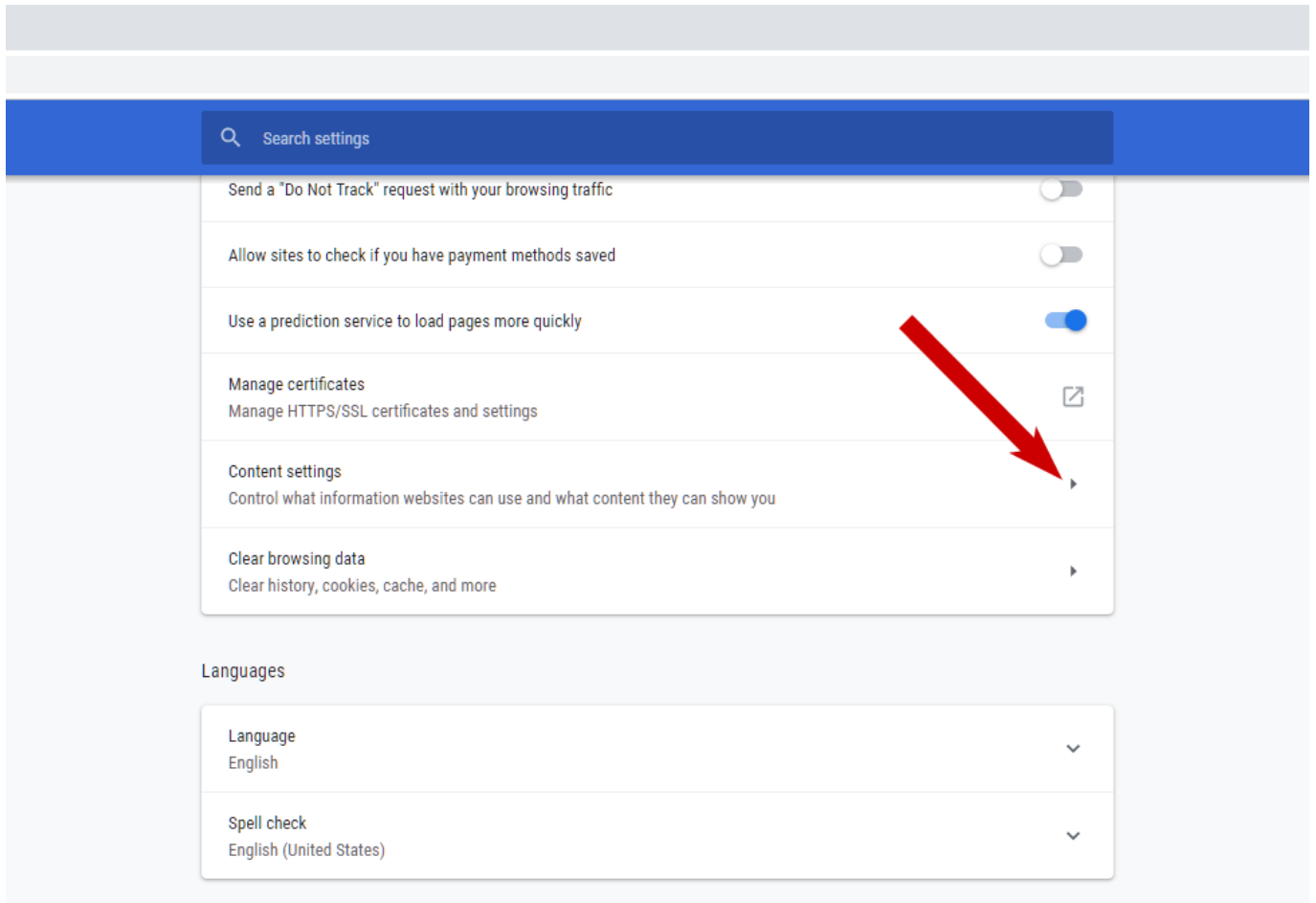

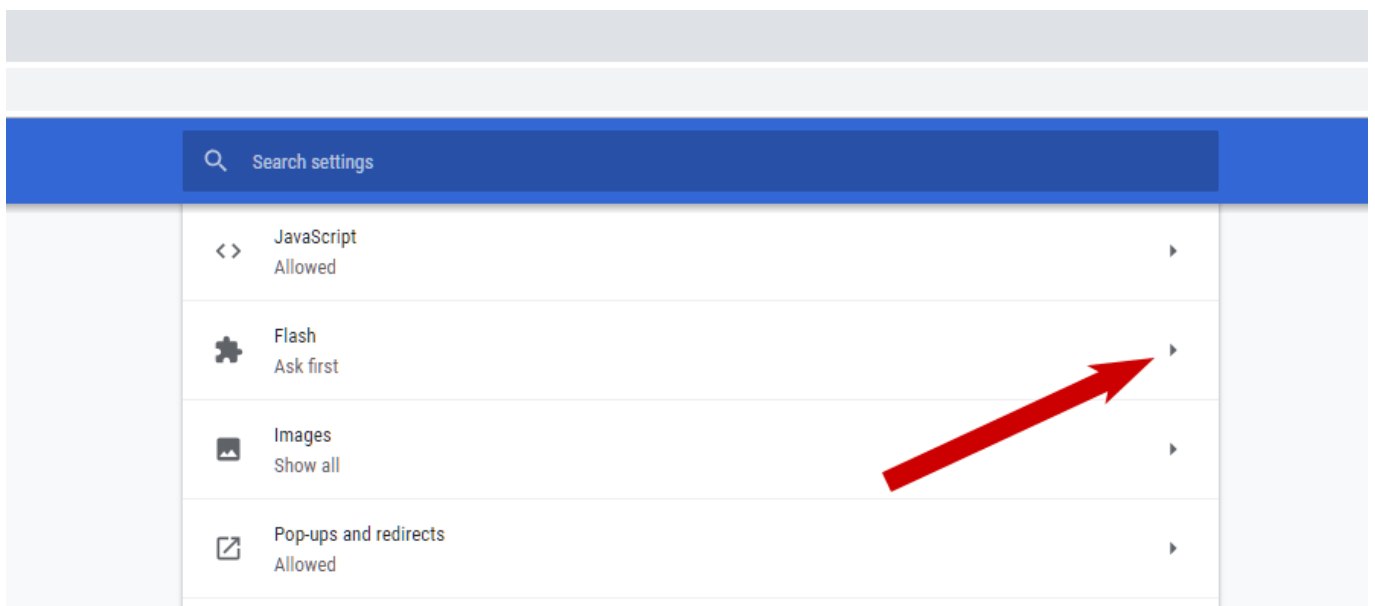
Step 4
